

Reference guide for setting up the Microsoft Authenticator app for Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA)


This document will highlight how to download and set up the Microsoft Authenticator application if you already have MFA enabled for your account but want to change the way you currently receive your code (i.e.: if you currently receive your MFA code via text message or phone call).

Why would I want to change to the Authenticator application method?

Using the Authenticator app to receive your MFA code is handy if you plan on travelling outside of the country. If you need to log in to your account while overseas, you can continue to receive your MFA codes through the Authenticator app (while being connected to Wi-Fi), without needing to active roaming and incur charges on your phone bill.

Follow the steps outlined below to set up the Microsoft Authenticator app for your account:


- 1. Go link to update your MFA preferences: https://aka.ms/mfasetup.
- 2. Click on the "Add sign-in method" box highlighted in the red box below:



3. Select the "Microsoft Authenticator app" option:



Add a sign-in method




4. Follow the prompt to download the Authenticator app on your phone by clicking "Download now".

You can also search for the app in your app store by searching for the "Microsoft Authenticator app" and looking for the following icons:





5. After you've downloaded the app, click "next" on the prompt telling you to download the app:
